On August 22, 2001 I interviewed Ms. Cora Fisher at Sunbridge Care & Rehabilitation for the Golden Isles located at 2611 Wildwood Drive, Brunswick, Georgia. The telephone number at the business is 912-264-1715 and her room phone number is 912-264-8482.

Ms. Fisher was sitting in her chair in her room at the time of the interview. She is very coherent and sharp as to what she remembers.

She described the individual that shot the victims as a white male, 25 to 35 years old, medium heights, slender build with brown hair, medium length. He was wearing a jeans jacket and jeans pants. He had on a gray colored shirt. He was also wearing a pair of big, thick, glasses.

She stated that she was in the church and looked directly at the man. She did not know if she could identify her at this time due to the years that have gone by. She kind of went into shock when this happened and knew that she had seen the man before but could not recall at that time who he was.

Ms. Fisher stated that in approximately 1987-1988 she was visited by a lady at the church. She stated that she would go to the church to help hand out food. The lady came to the church and showed her several photographs of a male and a baby. She was told by the lady that the male in the photograph was the father of her daughter's child.

The photograph that she remembers the most and the one that she identified the subject from was a photograph of the subject and a child laying on a small day bed. She froze when she saw the picture but she did not tell the lady that it was the suspect. |

This lady lived just down from Reed's store in a trailer. The lady told her that the male did come to their house a lot but stopped coming after the shooting. She stated that the male had told her in a conversation that he had shot a couple of "coons." The lady told her that the man in the picture was the suspect. The lady told her that she was going to send the photograph of the man to the television station.

Ms. Fisher could not remember the lady's name but stated that she did know the lady and her daughter. I ask Ms. Fisher if the names were Jane ~~Fisher~~ and Carol Young. She stated that she remembered the girl's name but was not sure of the woman's name.

Ms. Fisher stated that she immediately recognized the man in the picture. She stated that he was the same male that had killed the victims in the church. She remembered him shooting Mrs. Swain and then pointing the gun at her. She than froze and looked directly at the subject. She then fainted.

She did not tell Ms. Beaver that this was the suspect because she was afraid. She stated that even though she did not tell Ms. Beaver that this was the man Ms. Beaver knew that she knew who it was.

She recognized the man to be the grandson of one of her neighbors. She did not remember his name. He also had a brother or cousin. They used to ride around in their grandfathers car. She described the car as having a wine colored bottom and a black top.

After the homicide the subject drove by her house in his grandfathers car. She just froze. He just stared at her and then drove away. She told her husband (now deceased) about the man but she was to scared to tell the authorities.

She stated that Mrs. Marjorie Moore got several calls from a man who told her that he was going to get her for going to the police. She stated that this was also the same man. They all knew that it was him.

Ms. Fisher stated that on one occasion that Sheriff Bill Smith came to her and asked her about who the killer was. She stated that he told her the boy name. She stated that she knew who it was but that she did not identify the suspect to the Sheriff.

Ms. Fisher also stated that the subject went to school with one of her two sons. She could not remember if it was her son Archie or Jimmy. They went to Kingsland High School.

I asked Ms. Fisher if she was positive that this was the suspect. She stated that she was positive. She stated that she could not identify him today because it has been so long ago. I asked if it could have been someone that looked like Dennis Perry and she stated "only if he had a twin brother."

I advised Ms. Fisher that the police or attorneys were going to take a statement from her. She stated that she was not going to speak to anyone about this and was not going to tell them her story. I asked why and she would only laugh.
