be a credible person and of lawful age, who being by me first duly sworn, on her oath,
deposes and says:

My name is Horace Kevin Timmons. My address is [REDACTED]

I have known Terrance Lewis since 1993. We went to high school together. I have not seen or
spoken with Terrance Lewis since at least April 1997.

I was arrested in April 1997 and was not released from prison until September 2005.

After I got out of prison, I learned that Terrance Lewis was in prison, but not any specifics
about the crime or his imprisonment. I only recently learned that Terrance Lewis had been
arrested for the murder of Bernard Howard.

I learned this through the internet.

I am a facebook "friend" with Danielle Johnson. She and I have known each other since middle
school, since approximately 1991.

In January 2015, Danielle Johnson posted a picture of herself and Terrance Lewis on her
facebook page. This is when I first learned that Danielle Johnson is married to, or had any
connection with, Terrance Lewis.

I reached out to Danielle Johnson on the internet to let her know that I also knew Terrance
Lewis.

I then had several communications with Danielle Johnson, during which I learned that Terrance
Lewis was in prison for the murder of Bernard Howard.

On or about January 22, 2015, I explained to Danielle Johnson that, in the Summer of 1996, I
often hung out on Mr. Howard's street, that I was there on the night that he was murdered, and
that I saw the three assailants enter Mr. Howard's home shortly before the gunshot and leave
the house thereafter. Terrance Lewis was not one of the assailants.

I was never questioned by the police or anyone else in relation to Bernard Howard's murder.

I was not aware that Terrance Lewis was arrested for the crime until January 22, 2015. I knew
that this was a mistake, as Terrance Lewis was not present when the murder happened and
could not be guilty.

I have never reviewed any of the official materials from Terrance Lewis's case, such as pleadings, evidence, transcripts, witness statements, etc. No one has told me any specifics of the evidence presented at trial or any post-trial evidence.

I have not spoken with Terrance Lewis since 1997.

Other than Danielle Johnson and the lawyer, I have not spoken with anyone about Terrance Lewis's case.

After I spoke with Danielle Johnson, she contacted the lawyer who had most recently represented Terrance Lewis. I then went to meet the lawyer and explained to him everything that is in this Affidavit.

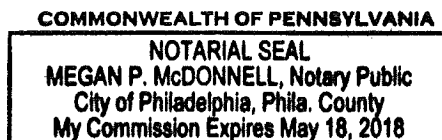

I am Terrance Lewis's wife. We were married on September 28, 2014.

I maintain a facebook page and have done so for several years.

Horace Timmons is one of my facebook "friends."

Mr. Timmons and I have known each other since middle school. We attended Shoemaker Middle School and Overbrook High School together. I would have been in the class of 1997 at Overbrook High School had I graduated.

Horace Timmons was a classmate, but I did not hang out with him or see him outside of school.

Terrance Lewis is one year older.

I grew up in the 5900 block of Nassau Road. Terrance Lewis and I were friends during this time period.

I was not in contact with Terrance at the time of the murder (August 1996) or of his arrest (1997). I first came back into contact with Terrance in Spring 2014. I learned that he was in prison through facebook, when another person with whom I had grown up "friended" me and told me that Terrance was in prison.

I subsequently corresponded with Terrance, visited him in prison and ultimately agreed to marry him.

Mr. Timmons had no idea that I was married to Terrance, or that Terrance was in prison.

After I was married to Terrance, I posted to my facebook page a picture of Terrance and myself. I posted the picture in approximately January 2015.

Mr. Timmons saw the picture and learned that I was married to Terrance and that Terrance was in prison.


Mr. Timmons also was directed to another facebook page maintained for Terrance that includes information about his conviction and sentencing for the murder of Bernard Howard. Prominently displayed on the facebook page is a link to the Pennsylvania Innocence Project's blog, dated April 14, 2011, entitled "Declared Actually Innocent But Still in Prison." This blog details that Magistrate Judge Carol Sandra Moore Wells ruled that Terrance was "actually innocent" of the murder.

After Mr. Timmons learned of the circumstances of Terrance's arrest, he contacted me by email and informed me that he was present on the street the night that Bernard Howard was murdered, that Terrance was not present and that he had information relevant to Mr. Howard's murder that would demonstrate that Terrance was not guilty of the murder. This happened on January 28, 2015.

This exchange was the first time that Horace Timmons and I had ever discussed Terrance's case.

To my knowledge Mr. Timmons has never reviewed any of the materials from Terrance's case, pleadings, evidence, transcripts, witness statements, etc. I have not provided him with any such materials and in fact I don't have any such materials.

After Mr. Timmons spoke with me, I spoke with Terrance who directed me to the lawyer who had most recently represented him. I then went to meet that lawyer with Mr. Timmons and explained to him everything that is in this Affidavit.

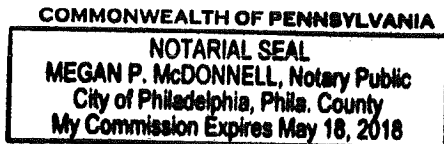

BEFORE ME, the undersigned Notary, Renee A. Libert, on this 23rd day of March, 2016, personally appeared Keith Christian, known to me to be a credible person and of lawful age, who being by me first duly sworn, on her oath, deposes and says:

My name is Keith Christian. I am currently incarcerated at SCI-Huntingdon. I was recently transferred to SCI-Huntingdon from Camp Hill, S.C.

I recently learned that Terrance Lewis is in prison for the murder of Bernard Howard. I learned this from a fellow inmate at SCI-Huntingdon who also grew up in West Philadelphia. We were discussing that juvenile lifers had been given a chance at resentencing, when this fellow inmate told me that one of the juvenile lifers at SCI-Huntingdon had been imprisoned for murdering someone on Sansom Street in West Philadelphia.

That is the first time that I learned that Terrance Lewis (who I did not know) was related to the murder of Bernard Howard. I learned this in Mid-February 2016. I first was able to speak with Mr. Lewis about what I knew about Mr. Howard's murder a short time after that.

I am familiar with Mr. Howard and his murder because we lived on the same block -- 6100 Sansom Street -- for 22 years.

In the Summer of 1996, I often hung out on my and Mr. Howard's street corner. I was present on that street on the night that Mr. Howard was murdered.

That evening, I was selling marijuana on the corner and watching a dice game involving several men. There were several other people out on the street that night as well.

I remember that a tan or beige car came down the street, drove past where I was standing and then parked several car lengths away from me.

I recognized the passenger as a person who I knew as "Naim." I had previously sold marijuana to Naim on several occasions. The driver of the car was a person who I knew as "Manny." He was known around the neighborhood as a gun man, although I did not know him well. Terrance Lewis is not Naim or Manny.

Naim and Manny entered Mr. Howard's house, which was an obvious and notorious crack house. I remember wondering why Naim and Manny would be going into the house.

A few minutes later, I saw a young, African-American man walk down the block and enter Mr. Howard's house. I did not know this man, although he was clearly not Terrance Lewis.

Ten to fifteen minutes later I heard a gunshot. Mr. Howard's door opened fast and Naim and Manny burst out and hurried to their car. They got in and drove away.

The younger African-American guy came out of the house next. He looked scared and walked away quickly.

Then, a neighborhood crackhead named Star came out of the house, yelling. Star is very hard to understand. I could not hear exactly what she said, but it was something like "help" and "they shot him."

Finally, an older, African-American couple came out of the house. They looked like they were high on crack. They walked west on Sansom towards 62nd Street.

When the police arrived, I went back to my house at 6[REDACTED] Sansom Street.

I was never interviewed by the police and I was never contacted by any lawyers about the case.

I did not know Terrance Lewis at the time and did not know that he had been arrested for the murder until recently.

I have never reviewed any of the official materials from Terrance Lewis's case, such as pleadings, evidence, transcripts, witness statements, etc. No one has told me any specifics of the case.
